




Tree and shrub maintenance has been effectively performed, enhancing the overall health and aesthetics of our green spaces.

The Parish Council has received various suggestions for areas of improvement, and now, we're eager to hear your thoughts on them, plus any more idea on how we may continue to improve the area.

IDEA - ONE

One area that has garnered more suggestions for improvement over any other is the Hay Meadow. Several residents have expressed that it's not meeting their expectations and would like to see enhancements made. One proposal is to transform it into a vibrant flower meadow, with a couple of scattered picnic spots, creating

inviting spaces for families to relax, enjoy lunch, and immerse themselves in the beauty of the flowers.

IDEA - TWO

Hedges - To remove or reduce in height the hedge along the southern and northern boundary, allowing everyone to enjoy an unobstructed view of the countryside beyond.





IDEA - THREE

Benches, the proposal is to remove those reaching the end of their safe usable life and gradually replace them. Additionally, residents may have the opportunity to sponsor memorial benches as part of the replacement process



IDEA - FOUR

Waste Land - Adjacent to the western entrance of Orchard Meadow lies a small patch of neglected land overrun by brambles and ivy. Suggestions have been made to clear this area and restore it to mowed grassland, enhancing its appeal and accessibility.





IDEA - FIVE

Swale - Over the years, the Swale has been neglected in terms of proper clearing and maintenance. It's now imperative to address this issue. Additionally, the fishing platform and bench are showing signs of deterioration, reaching the end of their safe usable lifespan. One suggestion is to clear the Swale thoroughly and

replace the platform and bench with similar structures, keeping in mind new regulations that require a 1-meter fence around this area.

IDEA - Six

More Equipment. When someone says what new equipment should we have in a playpark, people start thinking about, slides, swings, roundabouts, equipment for children, but what about adults? Would you like to see an outdoor table tennis table in Orchard Meadow? Would you play

Bocce Ball (similar to pétanque but, bocce ball uses larger and lighter balls)?
