COVID-19 RISK ASSESSMENT

Puddletown Recreation Ground Improvement and Development (PRIDE): Sports Pavilion Re-Opening – Puddletown Recreation Area

Background: All sports pavilions were closed by order of the government in response to the Covid-19 outbreak. From the 4th July, they are able to re-open but must be carefully managed. Only the cricket and football clubs (the 'sports clubs') are to be allowed to use the facility.

Signs will be placed at both ground floor entrances noting the one-way system, and clearly indicating "entrance" and "exit". Markings will be placed upon the floor indicating 2m distancing, and indicating the direction of flow for people entering and leaving the Sports Pavilion. A limit of 10 persons will be permitted in the ground floor of the Sports Pavilion. Sign will confirm this. A limit of 4 persons will be set for both changing rooms. Signs will confirm this. b) First Floor of the Sports Pavilion: One person at a time will be permitted to use the stairs to the ground floor of the Sports Pavilion. Signs will be placed at the bottom and the top of the stairs to the ground floor of the Sports Pavilion noting the limitations on use, and noting priority to people descending the stairs. Markings will be placed upon the floor indicating 2m distancing, and indicating the direction of flow for people entering and leaving the Sports Pavilion. A limit of 3 persons will be permitted in the upper floor of the Sports Pavilion. Signs will confirm this. c) General Issues: People using the Sports Pavilion must avoid unduly raising their voices to each other. This includes - but is not limited to - refraining from playing music or broadcasts that 	3	5	15 High

Refreshments will not be prepared, nor served in the Sports Pavilion in order to minimise contact with hard surfaces.
